


# TOTAL POPULATION



Population projection of Indonesia in **2019** is about **266.91** million people.

















Percentage of population who experience health complaints so the work, school or daily activities are interrupted










Percentage of population aged 0-23 months (BADUTA) who have been breastfed








APK of Primary School both for men and women are above 100 percent, that mean elementary student that is attend school more than the number of children aged 7-12 years












# SEX OF HEAD OF HOUSEHOLD


